

10.2 COUNCIL REPRESENTATION REVIEW - REPRESENTATION REVIEW REPORT**RESOLUTION 2021/136**

That Council:

1. Having considered Item 10.2 Council Representation Review - Representation Review Report receives and notes the report.
2. Having considered Item 10.2 Council Representation Review - Representation Review Report, endorses the updated Representation Review Report tabled at the 27 July 2021 ordinary meeting, for community engagement (as presented in *Attachments 1*) which provides that:
 - 2.1 The Principal Member of Council continues to be a Mayor, elected by the community;
 - 2.2 The Council area continue to be divided into four wards with retention of the same names (similar to the current ward structure although with changes to some internal ward boundaries to ensure entire streets (aside from main roads) fall within one distinct ward), with each of the wards being represented by two Councillors;
 - 2.3 Farrant Street, Gordon Road, Gray Street (portion), Day Lane, Newington Road, Newark Street and Johns Road in its entirety, along with portions of Prospect Road and Main North Road be removed from Ward 1 (North Ward) and added to Ward 3 (Central Ward), acknowledging future population growth projections; and
 - 2.4 The future elected body of Council comprise the Mayor and eight ward Councillors.
3. Note that the specific changes in line with Part 2.2 above are as follows:
 - 3.1 Beatrice Street (South) to be removed from Ward 2 (West Ward) and added to Ward 1 (North Ward);
 - 3.2 Pym Street (South) to be removed from Ward 2 (West Ward) and added to Ward 1 (North Ward);
 - 3.3 The boundary between Ward 1 (North Ward) and Ward 3 (Central Ward) move to Percy Street with all of Percy Street to be in Ward 1 (North Ward);
 - 3.4 Stevenson Street (South) to be removed from Ward 3 (Central Ward) and added to Ward 4 (East Ward); and
 - 3.5 D'Erlanger Avenue (West) to be removed from Ward 3 (Central Ward) and added to Ward 4 (East Ward).
4. Note that discussions have commenced through Council's Community Engagement team with appropriate Kaurna Elders and associations around naming / co-naming of Wards and that a question to the general public relating to exploration and acceptance of this proposal will be included in the community survey. However, any final outcomes around ward naming may need to be treated in a separate process given the inherent timeframes faced for the Representation Review and the sensitivities and journey that needs to occur with stakeholder groups.
