

Fact sheet 2 Phase 3 community consultation



What is the purpose of this consultation?

We're seeking your feedback on two key statutory steps required under the [Local Government Act 1999](#): the proposal to change the land classification of specific parcels within the Prospect Lifestyle Precinct, and the adoption of a new, site-specific Community Land Management Plan. Your input will be reviewed by Council and ultimately considered by the Minister for Local Government, who makes the final decision on land revocation.

How does this consultation build on previous phases?

This consultation is a necessary next step to implement the Prospect Lifestyle Precinct masterplan that Council endorsed in June 2025. It builds on the feedback we received in previous phases by moving from the project's strategic vision to the legal and planning processes required to make it a reality. Will my feedback be confidential?

Yes, all individual feedback is confidential. De-identified feedback, however, will be published in a report and presented to both Council and the Minister for Local Government.

What happens after the consultation closes? What will happen to my feedback?

After consultation closes, all feedback will be collated, analysed, and used to prepare a report for Council. Council will then vote on the next steps, including whether to submit the land revocation proposal to the Minister.

If submitted, the summary of public submissions will also go to the Minister for Local Government, who makes the final decision on the revocation.
